## **CUBS Research Impact Awards**



#### **CUBS Research Impact Award Winners**

On Tuesday April 30th we held our annual CUBS Research Awards Ceremony. This event celebrated colleagues who have won the Research Excellence Publication Award for 2022 and 2023 and the Research Excellence Impact Award for 2023. These annual awards allow for the recognition of research excellence in research publications and impact.

The Excellence Publication Award acknowledges colleagues who have published articles designated 3 and 4 star in the CUBS Journals List, based on the Chartered Association of Business Schools (CABS) Academic Journal guide plus selected non-business discipline journals to support our interdisciplinary agenda. Journals with ABS 3/4/4\* rankings represent the most original and well executed research papers within the business and management fields.

We are placing increasing emphasis on the impact of our research which has been emphasised over the past year in the supports put in place to assist colleagues in developing a series of impact case studies. In basic terms, our Impact Awards recognises research activity which is having notable nonacademic impact. This is in line with CUBS Strategic Vision which aspires for the School to be recognised for the quality, innovation, and impact of our research.

Dr Olive McCarthy Joint winner was Dr Olive McCarthy for her case study "Transforming how Credit Unions Measure and Report their Social Impact"

Olive's impact case study is based on 25 years' engagement with the Credit Union Sector an area of research which she published a wide range of journal articles and book chapters in. This impact case study has informed the development by the Irish League of Credit Unions (ILCU), a national trade and representative body, of the first nationally agreed series of social impact indicators for Credit Unions. These indicators are being used by Credit Unions across Ireland to improve how they measure, monitor and report their social impact while also informing practice in the UK and USA.

Adopting an engaged research approach, Olive undertook research with more than 34 Credit Unions across Ireland. This led to the publication 'Credit Union Social Impact Measurement and Reporting: Realising the Potential' in 2020. The recommendations from this research provided the basis for widespread dissemination and the development of these indicators.

This impact case study focused on the Integrated Patient Journey Map (IPJM), a visual design tool that assists multi-disciplinary teams in designing effective healthcare solutions. Emanating from a SFI funded research project between CUBS and UCC's Infant Research Centre this tool has had a truly significant impact.

In addition to academic impact, via journal article publications, this research it has led to positive impacts for patients in Ireland and also North Africa, Canada, the Netherlands, and UK.

Dr Jane Bourke Runner up was Dr Jane Bourke for her project titled "Partnering with policymakers to strengthen SME policy in Ireland and internationally"

This work focused on understanding what drives performance, innovation and productivity in small and medium-sized enterprises (SME's), Co-produced with policy makers, the work provides key stakeholders with an in-depth and nuanced understanding of policy intervention approaches. This research has directly shaped enterprise policy in Ireland, policy initiatives such as the 'Business Basics Programme' and 'Be The Business' in the UK, as well as informing policies of the Organisation for Economic Co-Operation and Development (OECD). This is a very strong example of how evidence based research on small businesses can have a direct and positive impact on the business community, policymakers and the public.
